#### SUPPORT SOUGHT FOR TEENS ENCOUNTER CHRIST (TEC)

(<u>Editor's Note</u>: The following article was written by Robin Berg, First Presbyterian Church, Hudson, Wisconsin, and a member of the United Cursillo Council.)

The United Cursillo Council would like to identify members of the 4th Day community who are interested in expanding the Cursillo movement to school age youth. Teens Encounter Christ (T.E.C.) and other similar programs are designed around the Cursillo weekend format except that these programs are aimed at a first encounter with Christ (for unchurched youth as well as our young members) rather than renewal and the forming of support groups.

Mickey and I really enjoyed having our children share their weekends and Christian growth with us when they were in high school. We would like you to have the same opportunity to share with your children, and we believe that we could spread the good news with many more of our youth if Cursillo churches supported this program.

I was greatly impressed with the quality, honesty and sincerity of the following young people when I asked for their impressions of the T.E.C. experience:

Stephanie Hill, a junior from Colonial, said the experience is "neat." She really felt loved and important while learning about the unconditional love of God.

Greg Olson, a sophomore from Christ Presbyterian, said that he entered a room of 50 strangers and three days later had found his 50 best friends, all of whom had in common the experience of growing closer to God.

Greg's brother Eric, a senior, cautions us that T.E.C. is not for everyone. Eric will be Kitchen Rector at the Episcopal T.E.C. taking place April 25-27 at St. Stephen's church in Edina. (Note: In T.E.C. palanca becomes "wheat.")

Suzi Poland, a senior from Minnewashta Church, found T.E.C. an "incredible experience," and a wonderful way to improve self-confidence and make new friends who really care about you.

Tim Berg, a junior at the University of Minnesota, and a member of First Presbyterian Church of Hudson, says this: "I have been involved with T.E.C. for six years. The value of the experiences shared, lessons learned and friendships made is immeasurable. My first T.E.C. weekend was a turning point in my life."

Recently I enjoyed the Guthrie performance of "The Rain-maker". It brought back memories of growing up on our farm and being constantly conscious of the weather -- too much rain, hail storms, drought, untimely early frosts. To a great extent, weather governed our daily activities and our economic well-being.

"The Rainmaker" also reminded me of this prayer, written as an editorial in the 1930's by the late William Allen White, the well-known editor from Emporia, Kansas.

## **Prayer For Rain**

O Lord, in thy mercy grant us rain and by that we don't mean a shower. We want to go out and watch the lightning rip across the southwestern sky in hot blue forks as the fat clouds roll in on us. We want to hurry home to close the house with the first fat drops the size of marbles, on a suddenly rising wind, chasing us and plunking on the car hood. We want to scramble all over the house, just as the first sheets descend, frantically slamming down the windows.

O Lord of Hosts, we want to look out of the windows and watch the regiments of close-packed raindrops march diagonally down. We want to hear the gurgle of the gutters under the eaves, and then the spatter of the downpour.

God of Israel. Isaac and Jacob, let it come down so hard, let the drops dance so high that the streets and sidewalks seem covered with a 6-inch fog of spatter-drops. Then let it just keep up for a while, and then begin to taper off, and then turn right around and get a lot worse, swishing, pounding, splattering, pouring, drenching, the thunder coming Crackity-BAM! and the lightning flashing so fast and furious you can't tell which flash goes with which peal of thunder. So that all the women will get scared and climb on top of the beds and scream at you not to get too close to that window.

And then, O Jealous God, repeat the whole act about three times and in the middle of the second time we will climb the attic stairs and put a wash pan under that tiny leak in the roof which usually you can't even notice in an ordinary rain. And after a couple of hours, kind of taper it down O Lord to a good steady rain — not a drizzle, but a businesslike one that keeps on until just about dawn and then spits a few drops occasionally during the morning from a gray sky.

Kansas is indeed the Promised Land, O Lord, and if it gets a break, it will flow with milk and honey. But we can't live much longer on promises.

So in Thine own way and in Thine own time, make up Thy mind, O Lord, and we will bow before Thy judgment and praise Thine everlasting name. Amen.
