Christian renewal within, not

outside, the church. It is meant as

a vehicle for Christian growth, not

as a conversion for non-Christians.

The Council is responsible for adminis-


tering the duties that will enable the Minnesota

United Cursillo to effectively serve those who have

experienced a Cursillo, as well as those who will participate

in the years to come. The Cursillo Method, as published in the

manual, is the primary source by which Cursillo weekends are governed.



UNITED TEC FOR TEENS? YOU CAN HELP...

The United Cursillo Council is interested in providing an experience similar to Cursillo for our teenage children. TEC (Teens Encounter Christ) is active within the Episcopal, Lutheran and Catholic Cursillo communities. Many United teenagers have already participated in TEC weekends. United 4th Day families -- either your teenage kids or you as a leader -- will now have an opportunitty to become involved in a United TEC. The United Council is committed to providing leadership, time and money to initiate TEC within the United community. Of course, United TEC will become a reality only with the support of many United families.

Support is needed in each of these areas:

- <> 10 to 12 people willing to serve on a TEC Council;
- Teens willing to attend TEC within the next six months and who then could serve on a team as a leader;
- Teens who have already attended a TEC weekend and would be willing to assume a leadership role on a TEC weekend;
- <> Clergy willing to serve on the TEC Council and/or in a leadership role on a TEC weekend.

Here's how you can help TEC:

- <> As an adult on a TEC weekend;
- <> As an adult on the initial developmental TEC Council;

'GOD MADE YOU HUMAN, NOT PERFECT!'

In August of 1982 when I came home from Cursillo, by best friend said, "Margo, you seem 'squeaky clean!' You look like you've just been to Disneyland and really celebrated life!" A few months ago, another really close friend said, "Margo, you seem like a little kid in sharing feelings — so spontaneous and honest and open." I can truly say that I feel like a little kid — only five or six or seven years old — for lots of reasons, and I have all of you to thank.

My religious background growing up was disjointed, confusing and embarrassing. I learned that "God is love," The Lord's Prayer, "Jesus

loves me, this I know..." the 23rd Psalm, the Golden Rule, and the Ten Commandments (kind of, but never memorized them). The words christening, confirmation, (first) communion, resurrection, confession, eucharist, homily, baptism, godparents, etc. — the words may well have been one and the same to me because I had no idea what they were or what my friends were talking about.

As an adult I truly searched for a faith and a spiritual home and family but finally gave up. In November 1979 at age 36, I was forced into counseling for a number of reasons and very reluctantly began to identify feelings that I had never learned even existed. It was the lowest time in my life and I was really down and out.

Colonial Church found me in March 1980...I didn't find it. On my first Sunday there with four others from my apartment complex, 10 people from all walks of my life came up to welcome me with huge hugs. I am forever grateful and I knew that day that Colonial was "home." On November 16, 1980, I joined Colonial and was baptised. That was an incredible day in my life — scary and beautiful. I truly was a new little baby, crying, forgiven, washed clean of my old mistakes, and given a new beginning. I was there with two non-member friends and a huge new extended family. Not until a year later did I realize that that's normally a family day for moms and dads and sisters and brothers. I hadn't even thought of it.

Arthur's (Rev. Arthur Rouner) Wendesday morning Bible Study at the Sofitel became my support group in December 1981 and remains so today. My daily 20 minute "morning message" time also became forever invaluable and very precious to me.

Then in August of 1982, I attended the first Lutheran single coed Cursillo. New beginnings again! The environment rollo opened me up like a geyser! And the button I received that said "God made you human, not perfect" was a totally new enlightenment to me. What a relief! No wonder I came home "squeaky clean!" As a bonus I gained a hundred beautiful new Christian friends, at least half of whom I still see and love today.

Serving on four Cursillo teams, Loaves and Fishes, Christian Volunteers of Minnesota and now the United Cursillo Council continues to help me grow personally, emotionally and spiritually. It's incredible to me how I can feel so much deeper as a woman and also more spontaneous as a kid in these few short years. I'm calm and peaceful. And my faith grows stronger every day. From Hebrews ll: "Faith is the absolute positive assurance what what you want is going to happen even if you can't see it up ahead." I know that's true for me, in God's time, and I'm so glad! Thank you all!

SELECTING CHURCH LOCATIONS FOR CURSILLO WEEKENDS

It is my job as site selection coordinator to line up a church for each pair of weekends scheduled by the Cursillo Council. The criteria I use for selection are fairly straight-forward — the church must be both willing and able to host a weekend. In addition, I attempt to provide some diversity of church denomination and location within and outside of the Twin Cities. Frankly, this has been difficult at times due to the relatively low number of churches capable of hosting a weekend. It is in this regard that I am asking all of you to help me. The pool of potential host churches must be enlarged if we are to continue staging four pairs of weekends per year.

As you continue reading, try to visualize your church hosting a weekend. Then, in the following week or two, discuss the possibility during your renewal groups and ultreyas. Finally, I would like each liaison (or pastor or volunteer, if no liaison exists) to fill out the planning form and return it to me, even if there is no possibility of ever hosting a Cursillo. Completing this form does not commit your church to hosting a weekend, but it will help the Council greatly in future planning.

The need can be seen more clearly by looking at some weekend statistics. The United Cursillo community will have been in existence six years in May. At last count, the community included 47 churches. There have been 18 pairs of weekends hosted at 12 different churches. Four churches have hosted 11 pairs of weekends. one has hosted four pairs of weekends. Two churches are no longer able to host weekends. In other words, 8% of available churches have hosted 61% of the weekends. This affords the remainder of the churches an excellent opportunity to help spread the message of Cursillo!

Planning is underway for 1988 and it would help a great deal if forms could be returned to me by May 15. (WARNING: This form is being used for the first time so it is untested...I will appreciate any suggestions that would improve both the form and our ability to evaluate potential sites. Return your comments with the form, separately by mail, or by phone (439-0255).

View from the Cliff...

A 4th Day friend wrote recently to inquire about whether a music album or cassette tape of Cursillo songs has ever been recorded. His belief was that many Cursillistas would appreciate a record or tape, if available.

The only recording with which I'm familiar is "God Is So Good" by Anna Mae Vagle (available at Logos Bookstore). Songs include Sing a New Song, Look Out Your Window, Pass It On, Have You Seen Jesus My Lord, Allelujah,

How Great Thou Art, Let Us Break Bread, Amazing Grace, Spirit of the Living God, and God Is So Good.

If you know of other recordings, let me know and I'll include them in a future Palanca Press. One problem associated with recording some of the songs sung at Cursillo weekends is that various songs are protected by copyright or can be recorded only by special permission. Examples of copyrighted songs include Seek Ye First, Hear O Lord and Pass It On.

On a somewhat related "note," several musicians have commented at clausuras and other Cursillo gatherings that a "Cursillo jam session" would be a fun event. If you play an instrument, I'd like to hear from you -- would you be willing to come to an evening or Saturday jam session? The purpose would be partly to review the music and determine whether everybody's playing tunes the same way. We may also be able to teach each other some new tunes. An additional purpose would be to learn exactly what's involved in being a rollo room music director, assistant music director or palanca chapel music director. If you would like to be notified of a Cursillo jam session as outlined here, send me a postcard or note and I'll make sure you're informed of the time and place.

My spiritual fuel tank was approaching empty several months ago and I needed a fill. Then, through a series of coincidences (ha!), I came across an organization that has provided some welcome octane and brought me in contact with a number of Christian brothers and sisters. My new ministry may be of interest to some of you, so I'll provide some details and if it "trips your trigger," give me a call or write, and I'll tell you more.

The ministry is an arm of the Fellowship of Christian Atheletes. In 1986, FCA affiliated with a national-level group of professional fishermen who were attempting to begin big-money bass tournaments with a time of prayer and to spend time together in Christian fellowship.

FCA offered its support and launched the National Fishing Ministry. In March, I joined a group of volunteers to start a Minnesota chapter of FCA's National Fishing Ministry called "Fishing Friends." One of the key leaders of our local chapter is Ron McConico, teen director at Hospitality House in north Minneapolis. Another leader is Reggie Thiel, director of Camp Fish at Walker, MN, a youth camp that teaches kids how to fish and enjoy the outdoors.

Our goal is to meet monthly in Christian fellowship and discuss where the crappies are hitting or how to attract trophy bass or muskies. We'll hear from professional fishermen who have Christ at the center of their lives. We'll also attempt monthly fishing outings with sons, daughters or kids who have neither the means nor an adult to go fishing with.

I especially enjoyed working in FCA's booth at the recent Sportsman Show at the Minneapolis Auditorium. We had hundreds of sign-ups for a free week at Camp Fish and many Christian outdoors-type folks who stopped by to wish us well.

If a Christian fishing club that fishes for both fish and men/women interests you, let me know and I'll send you the latest information.
