Thank you to the 53+ of you who have completed and returned the Sponsorship Survey that was included in the August issue of the Palanca Press. It is very encouraging to see that the majority of you are familiar with the process of sponsorship and have had very positive experiences being a sponsor!

It was interesting to read about obstacles that keep you from sponsoring:

- 3 felt the weekend is too long for average commitment.
- 5 felt that clergy do not actively support UEC, so people aren’t interested.
- 9 felt that various UEC policies should be re-evaluated.
- 2 expressed concern about comfort (sleeping on the floor, etc.).
- 13 said prior church commitments keep you from sponsoring.

It is inspiring to hear about what motivates you to sponsor?

- “I want to share the deep, wonderful experience I had.”*
- “To share God’s boundless love in a joyous way.”*
- “The look on their faces when surprised on Sunday morning.”*
- “To help friends find deeper meaning in the relationship with Christ.”*
- “Seeing someone experience real, tangible grace for the first time.”*

Many of your comments reinforced the findings of the recent Long Range Task Force. If you haven’t yet sent your survey in, please do! The UEC Council is considering all feedback and continues to explore ways to help UEC spread God’s grace!

Convenors Corner

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

UEC operates on prayer. Weekends are bathed in prayer. Prayer is the fuel that powers our Christian service. As the new UEC Convenor, I want share some of the answers to prayer that I have received as a way of introducing myself. Consider **James 4:3-4**, “*You do not have because you do not ask. You ask and do not receive because you ask amiss, that you may spend it on your pleasures.*” In other words, it is important to pray with the proper motives.

Each year a number of Christian bikers attend the Black Hills Motorcycle Rally. We ask God to grant us opportunities to serve Him. Events always unfold to make it a unique adventure.

One year, Frank needed to stop to ask for directions. Can you imagine a biker asking for directions? An elderly gentleman named Tom answered the door. After a friendly chat, Frank headed out. The following year we went to visit Tom who told us that his wife had died the previous September. We discussed his relationship with God, and Frank asked him if he would like to invite Jesus into his heart; and he did. Tom and Frank are now close friends, and stay in touch on a regular basis. ***Make a friend, be a friend, bring a friend to Christ.***

We have twice been the first ones on the scene of a motorcycle accident, and stopped to render first aid, staying until the medical professionals arrived. Several times we have assisted motorcyclists experiencing mechanical difficulties. “***Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.***” **Matthew 25:40**

Last year we attended a motorcycle rally in Thunderbay Canada. On day two of our journey, my motorcycle broke down. Since there was no cell phone coverage, Frank went to find a phone to call for a tow truck. At the first house, he met Dave and Bea, who allowed us to do some chores at their farm in exchange for staying with them while we waited for my bike to be repaired. They shared with us God’s vision for their farm to become a Christian Center. The obstacles to the realization of this vision are primarily financial. Bea believed God had sent us to their home in answer to their prayers for help. They invited us to come again, and bring other people who would help them work on various projects. In June of this year 10 people accepted their offer. Bea calls us her angels, but we are just servants of God trying to respond to the opportunities He has put before us. The Christian Center is currently a 350 acre farm, adjoining a lake, with multiple buildings. We pray that it will soon be a tool for God to use in furthering His Kingdom.

By prayerfully making ourselves available and looking for service opportunities, we can be used by God. With a servant’s heart, and Jesus as our guide, we too can be useful in the Master’s hands. We just need to watch where God is working, join Him there, and pray.
