\*Directors/Officers Expense includes expenses incurred by Council members that are not directly attached to a weekend: bonding/insurance for Council members, postage/ink/copies for typical Council activities, building rental for monthly meetings, etc.

In September 2010 I began serving the UEC Council as Secretary. My responsibilities are about record keeping and correspondence and include:

- Recording the Minutes of Council meetings
- Preparing a ministry report from all Council members and committees within the Council for each meeting
- Preparing 25-30 letters for each meeting to UEC Clergy. The Council prays for each by name and signs each letter. That means we pray through the entire list of UEC clergy (250+) in about a year.
- Keeping the roster of current voting and non-voting Council members
- When we hear of needs, the Council also sends sympathy, get well and thank-you cards to 4th Day members. This also falls to the Secretary to prepare and bring to Council meeting for signing and praying for these needs and mailing the cards. In the past year, we mailed nearly 50 cards.

This position has brought a great understanding of the role of the Council within UEC. God has blessed me and I know that He will continue to do so in the upcoming year.

Musicians ... you can expect to see new regulations regarding the music you use, but our respect of your creativity will certainly be considered and we promise you won't be given a script to follow. It is important both for our organization and for the churches in which we minister that we follow the laws with regard to this licensing.

## A Word About Sponsorship Submitted by Kathy Walker, Convenor Advisor

At this writing, my term on Council has ended. But I'd like to present these retrospective thoughts regarding UEC and the lack of sponsorship of Weekenders that Council constantly struggles with. This is not a reprimand, but something for us to pray about and think about together as a community.

In the six years that I've spent on Council, as I recall, here are some of the actions taken:

- Council voted to not hold a weekend if there were fewer than nine Weekenders accepted.
- Council voted to go from four sets of weekends per year to three sets of weekends per year to try to create "fuller" weekends.
- In 2007, a special "Sponsorship" issue of the Palanca Press was published to encourage Sponsorship. This is included in all Weekender Welcome packets.
- Twice, when approaching a weekend with minimal Weekenders registered, Council sent a desperate plea in the form of a postcard asking for more Weekenders. This did not work as successfully as we hoped.
- Council re-voted and decided to hold a Weekend for even only one Weekender.
- While we encouraged against it, Council voted to allow the man or woman of a couple to attend without their spouse. This was for a variety of reasons, including to increase attendance at weekends.
- Council voted to extend the invitation of UEC to Christian people who attend church somewhere other than a church already established in UEC. Again, this was for a variety of reasons, including to increase attendance at weekends.

And yet, today, we continue to struggle to fill our weekends. We are not alone. Other cursillo organizations also struggle. Many of us remember years ago when UEC had 4-5 sets of weekends per year, a single women's weekend and every weekend had a significant waiting list for Weekenders.

What has changed? It's hard to say for sure. We are busier. Our churches have more relevant programs. Our friends who we want to sponsor are busier. We are procrastinators and wait until two weeks before a weekend to ask someone.

Will you think about this with me? Will you be intentional about praying and asking WHO to invite to UEC? Will you ask them to pray? Will you do this 3-4 months before a set of weekends, so it is not rushed, but thoughtfully "worked" not only by you, but so that God has time to "work" as well? Will you pass this wonderful gift of cursillo on to as many as you can?

This is the process of discipleship that God has called us to. If you have not before, will you join me in taking it seriously?
