I have had been blessed to serve the Unidos en Cristo ministry in many different avenues since my initial weekend, #216, in January, 2006, at Colonial Church, Edina. One of the opportunities has been serving as the Palanca Press Editor for the past few years.

In March of this year, I was diagnosed with a cancer which was aggressive and would need follow-up chemotherapy treatment. With the diagnosis in hand, I did not feel I would be able to do justice to the Palanca Press publication and gave my resignation effective after this edition.

I have had surgery to remove the cancer. The pathology report following the procedure did not match the original biopsy results. The biopsy was retested by OB/GYN specialists and the new results matched the surgical report.

I did have cancer but not the aggressive cancer originally diagnosed. They were able to remove all of the cancer and everything around the uterus was benign. There is no need for any follow-up treatment. I have been declared cancer-free. To God be the glory!

I am on the mend and daily regaining physical strength and energy. As others walk the cancer journey, either in your personal lives or with those who are dear to you, I pray that more would be able to experience these same results as I have.

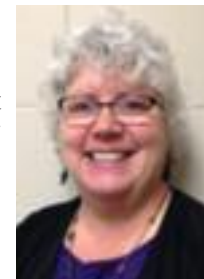
